In addition to this, the Junior School Council will be leading a footy kick competition down at the oval from 8:45am. Junior School Council will announce a winner for the longest kick at 9am.


After this you are all invited to see our footy/sports parade just after 9am.



Don't take your dragon to the castle. The dragon will burn the castle down and the people. (Brianna 1/2B)


Don't take your crocodile for a swim to the pool because it will scare the people and if you are struggling, the lifeguard won't safe your life. (Cole 1/2C)

#### Fees

Daily fee of \$76

Fee after max CCS\* \$15.20 per day

Incursion day fee of \$94

Fee after max CCS\* \$20.00

The additional cost of \$18 for incursion days will be charged per child even if your child doesn't participate.

\* The amount of CCS you can get depends on your circumstances and the hourly rate cap set by the Government. To find out if you are eligible, simply log into your MyGov and complete your CCS Assessment.

Please note: Child/ren must attend the first and last day of care in order to receive CCS.

#### How to book

- Read through <u>fee and cancelation policy</u>
- 2. Complete Enrolment, Booking and Payment form

NOTE If your child has a medical condition they can only attend the Holiday Program if the Action Plan, Risk Minimisation Plan and Communication have been completed and submitted prior to attendance. Any medication associated with the action plans must be brought to the program each day they attend. If medication is not supplied on the day, the child may not attend the program. This rule applies for all diagnosed medical conditions.

#### Absences

All bookings are charged prior to attendance. This secures your child's spot in the Holiday Program. Staffing is based on attendance. If your child is sick or not attending a booked session, please call and notify the program before 8.30am. Please review the cancellation policy with regards to if a credit can be applied, as in some instances credit may not be able to be applied.

#### Age to attend

To qualify for enrolment in Windermere's Holiday Program children must be attending primary school (in that year).

#### Priority of access

Windermere's Holiday Program is offered to the general community.

Priority of Access will be given to:

- Children at risk of serious abuse or neglect and families in crisis.
- Children of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families.
- Children attending the host school and other Windermere OSHC Schools.
- 4. Children residing within the LGA.

#### Your safety and COVID-19

#### Please help us keep the program safe by:

Keeping any children who are sick at home, if anyone in your household is unwell and awaiting a COVID test result we ask you keep children at home (even if they are not displaying any symptoms). The children/child can attend the program once a negative test result has been confirmed and if they have a booking.

#### We will keep you COVID safe by:

We have developed COVIDSafe plan and risk assessment that encourages social distancing of staff, consistent staffing where possible, increased cleaning and disinfecting and signing children in and out of the program.
