Hello Parents and Friends,

Thanks to all the parents and friends who come along to assembly each week. Your support of your children and of our school makes a difference! Next week we will see how our senior students are going learning to play the ukulele.

Mathematics is part of everyday life. We encounter mathematical situations all day every day. We have been featuring a section on Maths each week in our newsletter, and I thank all of you who have tried some of the ideas with your children. Some professional learning I have done recently has reminded me of how important our attitude, as adults, is to our children. How many times have you said "I'm not good at Maths" or "I couldn't do Maths at school"? I've definitely been guilty of this, and I wonder how many of our children have been adversely influenced by this attitude. Today a Grade 1 boy said to me "Maths isn't my thing!" In the past I may have said "It isn't mine either", but today I said "It can be if you want it to be!" Let's all think about the messages we give our kids.

Thanks to Sandie's great work in our Eco Zone we have lots of budding gardeners at school. We need some of the spaces to prepare gardens for each class, so we are looking for new homes for some of our animal cages. Please see the office if you are interested.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

Hello!

I thought I would introduce myself. My name is Sarah Moore and I am the school council president here at Cardinia Primary School. I have 4 children who have been at the school since they started prep. My eldest has already graduated to high school with my second graduating grade 6 this year.

When my children first started school I didn't even know we had a school council and I had no idea what they did, so I wanted to let you know a bit about how school council works and what we do, in case you don't know either. Each week we'll have a school council corner in the newsletter and include some information about school council. This week we'll look at who makes up a school council.

School council at primary school level is made up of parent, teacher, and can also include Community members. Each school differs in the number of members they are allowed to have; however, parent membership needs to be more than one third of the total council members. School council at Cardinia includes Mrs Wepster, 4 teachers, 7 parent members and 2 community members. Community members can include parents or those within the broader Cardinia community.

At the start of each year, Mrs Wepster will issue a call for nominations for parents (you can nominate yourself or another parent can nominate you) and teachers. If there are more nominations than positions available, a ballot will be conducted, and voting will take place. This is where any parent at the school is able to vote as to whom they might like to have on school council from the nominations received.

In March an Annual General Meeting (AGM) is held and at this meeting a school council president is elected. The school council president is elected by the members of council and serves for 1 year, or more if elected again the following year.


School council meets 8 times a year., which is usually 2 meetings per term.

Dear Parents/Carers

As part of the delivery of our Health curriculum this term we are having the Life Education mobile classroom visit our school from Thursday 17th October until Thursday 24th October 2019.

Life Education has been visiting our school for many years and is always a highlight of the children's year. This year we have selected lessons that complement The Resilience Project and our Respectful Relationships program.

Foundation – Harold's Friendship
Grade 1 – Safety Rules
Grade 2 – Growing Good Friends
Grade 3 – All systems go
Grade 4 – B-Cyberwise
Grade 5 – Relate Respect Connect
Grade 6 – Think Twice

The sessions are always fun, interactive and extend and develop the children's understanding of the topics covered. Harold, the Life Education giraffe mascot, is always a much anticipated element of the Life Education visit.

It is important that your child attend this session. Teachers will be further broadening these topics in class both prior to and after the Life Education visit.

The cost for this incursion is \$6.00 per child.




HELPING YOUR CHILDREN WITH MATHEMATICS



There are a number of general principles which you might keep in mind when you are helping your children.

Number Games, Board Games & Other Games

There are a range of games that are published in books which are suitable as family games and practice mathematics skills. One card game commonly available now is called Numero which can be purchased in games' shops and newsagents. These provide practice with mental arithmetic. There are also more traditional games such as Gin Rummy, Snakes and Ladders, and Ludo which provide some experience at addition and useful practice for children.



When playing games for which there is a degree of logical thinking implied, talk with the children about better moves, or plays which lead to winning. Think together about ways which help not to lose, rather than win. Verbalising strategies is important for logical thinking.

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


