PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Evacuation

As part of keeping your children safe at school we are required to have either an evacuation or lockdown drill once per term. Terms 1 and 2 will be announced, Terms 3 and 4 will not be announced. Our first drill will be an evacuation drill and, weather permitting, will be on Tuesday.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN stands for National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy, and it occurs across Australia every May, this year on the 12th, 13th and 14th May. All students in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 are required to sit these tests. Further information will be sent out closer to the dates. This year we will again have paper copies of the test.

Technology

If you haven't signed a 2020 Digital Technologies Agreement for your children they will not be allowed to use technology at school. Please sign this as soon as you can.

Allergies

Allergies are a big part of life for many people, and for some they can be life threatening. Please be aware of the food your children bring to school, and remind them not to share their food with others. Please be particularly careful with peanuts, and if you have a child in Grade 1, please do not send any food containing peanuts in your child's lunch box.

PERSONAL DETAILS

If any of your personal contact or medical details have changed please let the office know. It is very important that we have up-to-date student information in case of emergencies.

TISSUE BOXES

Every year we ask our school families to donate 2 boxes of tissues for students to use in their classrooms. This helps us immeasurably by keeping our school costs down each year. If you haven't already donated, could each family please supply 2 boxes of tissues (can be any brand) and hand them **into the office**.

DISABLED CAR PARKING

Just a reminder that the Disability Car Parking Section in the School Car Park is designed for those who have a Disabled Sticker on their car. Please do not park in this spot unless you have the correct sticker.

LATE ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL AND EARLY LEAVING

Just a reminder, if students are running late to school, parents should sign them in at the office and get a green pass to present to the teacher. If parents need to pick up a student from school earlier, they need to come to the office first and sign their child out.

Student Medication



If you have completed a Medication Request Form from last year for you child/ren and wish to continue having medication kept at school, the Department of Education requires you to complete a **new** Medication Request Form.

The Medication Request Form is available at the Office. Medication cannot be given to students without this form having been completed.

We are unable to give students medication that is past its expiry date so please come into the office and check if the medication we hold for your child is still within its expiry date.



Medication to treat asthma, an allergy or anaphylaxis does not need to be accompanied by a Medication Request Form provided a student has an Asthma Care Plan, an Action Plan for Allergic Reactions or Action Plan for Anaphylaxis.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

Hello!

I hope all your children have had a great start to the year.

Last year I put some information about how a school council works in the newsletter. For the sake of our new parents and seeing as we have school council elections coming up, I thought it would be beneficial to revisit this information again.

When my children first started school I didn't even know we had a school council and I had no idea what they did, so I wanted to let you know a bit about how school council works and what we do, in case you don't know either. Each week we'll have a school council corner in the newsletter and include some information about school council.

School council at primary school level is made up of Parents, Teachers, and can also include Community members. Each school differs in the number of members they are allowed to have; however, parent membership needs to be more than one third of the total council members. School council at Cardinia includes Mrs Wepster, 4 teachers, 7 parent members and 2 community members. Community members can include parents or those within the broader Cardinia community.

At the start of each year, Mrs Wepster will issue a call for nominations for parents (you can nominate yourself or another parent can nominate you) and teachers. If there are more nominations than positions available, a ballot will be conducted, and voting will take place. This is where any parent at the school is able to vote as to whom they might like to be on school council from the nominations received. They are elected in time to attend the Annual General Meeting (AGM) at the start of the year.

In March an AGM is held and at this meeting a school council president is elected. The school council president is elected by the members of council and serves for 1 year or more if elected again the following year/s.

School council meets 8 times a year for approx 1-2 hours.

The main responsibilities of the school council are:

- Overseeing the development of the school's annual budget
- Participating in the development and monitoring of the school strategic plan*
- Developing, reviewing and updating policies** that reflect a school's values and support the school's broad direction outlined in its strategic plan.

Some other functions of the school council might include (but not limited to):

- Raising funds for school use.
- Maintaining school grounds and facilities.
- Reporting annually to the school community and the Department
- Creating interest in the school in the wider community
- Representing and taking the views of the community into account
- Regulating and facilitating after-hours use of school premises and grounds
- Operating a children's service at the school.

Being involved in school council gives you an opportunity to have your say on what you would like to see happen around the school and to help better the educational opportunities for our children at Cardinia.

SCHOOL COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2019

Our year started with the annual school beach picnic. As always, this day was well attended and enjoyed by our school community.

On Friday the 15th of March our school joined with the Armstrong family in remembering Mr Alan Armstrong, by opening his beautiful garden memorial. Thoughtful words were expressed by our school captains as well as a beautiful song sung by some of our students. It was a lovely time to remember our wonderful late principal.

Possibly the most looked forward to event of the school year was when our new inclusive schools playground finally opened, just in time for our leaving grade 6 students to have a few weeks of play! Thanks, in particular, to Mrs Mattingley for all of the hard work put in to making it happen!

2019 also saw the return of Meal Deals, which not only provide the children with something to look forward to each week, but also helps raise funds for the school. Additionally, throughout the year, school council was able to hold other effective fundraisers. Providing the canteen at district cross country, Bunnings BBQ's, Easter and Christmas raffles, running the BBQ and cake stall at the Pakenham and District Aircraft Radio Control Society, and our very exciting Colour Fun Run. A total of \$19,743.04 was raised and we would like to thank the members of school council, as well as many others in our school community who contribute their time and efforts in making these fundraisers successful. Further money was also raised by our grade 6 students for their end of year trip to Luna Park.

This year, monies from our fundraising efforts were able to be used to purchase some new TV's for classrooms and iPads for our students, as well as to upgrade our sewerage. Any remaining monies will be added to next years funds.

Around the school we were also able to upgrade the boys toilet and hang positive messages up for the children to read.

Out of the school and on the roads, we petitioned and were able to get additional and bigger speed limit signage on Cardinia and Ballato Roads.

Our friends at Bendigo Bank and Clyde Bunnings have provided some fantastic support to us this year. We were able to receive a grant from Bendigo Bank to upgrade the books in our library, while Clyde Bunnings donated 3 garden beds and tools for our new Eco Zone. It was sad to say goodbye to our animal farm, but the children are very excited to participate in the new Eco Zone area.

We farewelled some wonderful teachers and aides and said a temporary goodbye to a few as they look forward to welcoming their babies.

Our year ended with our wonderful children performing in the Christmas concert and the children were all delighted with a visit from old Saint Nick who presented them with a lovely book each and a bag of treats, including a melody pop which provided us all with additional music after the concert was finished! Thanks to everyone who helped in making the night an enjoyable one.

The Zones of Regulation

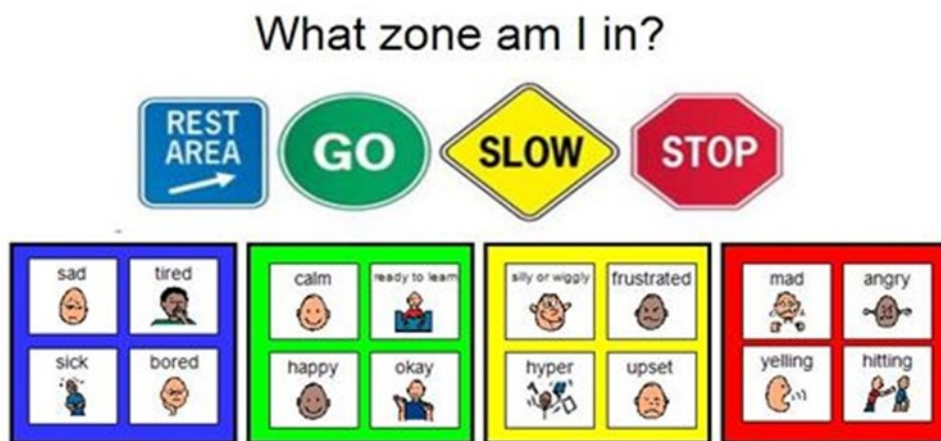
As part of our Wellbeing curriculum we are introducing a new program across the school this year which is aimed at helping students identify their feelings, learn self regulation tools, problem solve positive solutions and understand how their behaviours influence other's thoughts and feelings. The Zones of Regulation has 4 coloured zones to describe how your brain and body feel:

BLUE Zone- your body is running slow, such as when you are tired, sick, sad, bored. (Relates to a REST area road sign)

GREEN Zone - like a green light, you are "good to go". Your body may feel happy, calm, focused. (Relates to a green go traffic sign)

YELLOW Zone- when you start to lose control, such as when you are frustrated, anxious, worried, silly or surprised. Use caution in this zone. (Relates to a Caution, Slow down road sign)

RED Zone- this zone is for EXTREME emotions when you are out of control. You have trouble making good decisions and must stop. (Relates to red STOP road sign)



Key Messages in the Program:

*NO Zone is bad and it is ok to be in any of the Zones. However, it is not ok to hurt someone if you are in the red zone, and it's not good to stay in the red, blue or yellow zone for too long. We are aiming to be in the GREEN zone most of the time.

*You can be in more than one zone at the one time. You might feel anxious (yellow) and tired (blue) at the same time.

*The same emotion can be categorised in more than one zone. It depends on the INTENSITY of the emotion. Sad can be blue, but really really upset can be red.

*People can experience situations differently. For example a long wait at the Doctor's office may make a person feel bored (blue). But another person may feel anxious (yellow) or happy (green) because they get to play on Mum's phone while they wait.

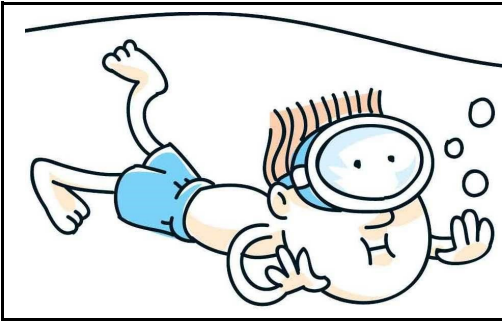
Why are we teaching this?

We are teaching our students good coping and self regulation strategies so they can help themselves when they feel stressed, anxious, sad or angry. The Zones of Regulation is popular with Speech therapists and Occupational therapists, and it's creator is Leah Kuypers. I am excited to be able to bring this learning to students at Cardinia Primary. All classes will be introduced to the Zones this term. Students will learn more about themselves in the Zones, their triggers, and about self regulation tools they can use, as the year progresses. Please see me if you would like more information about this program.

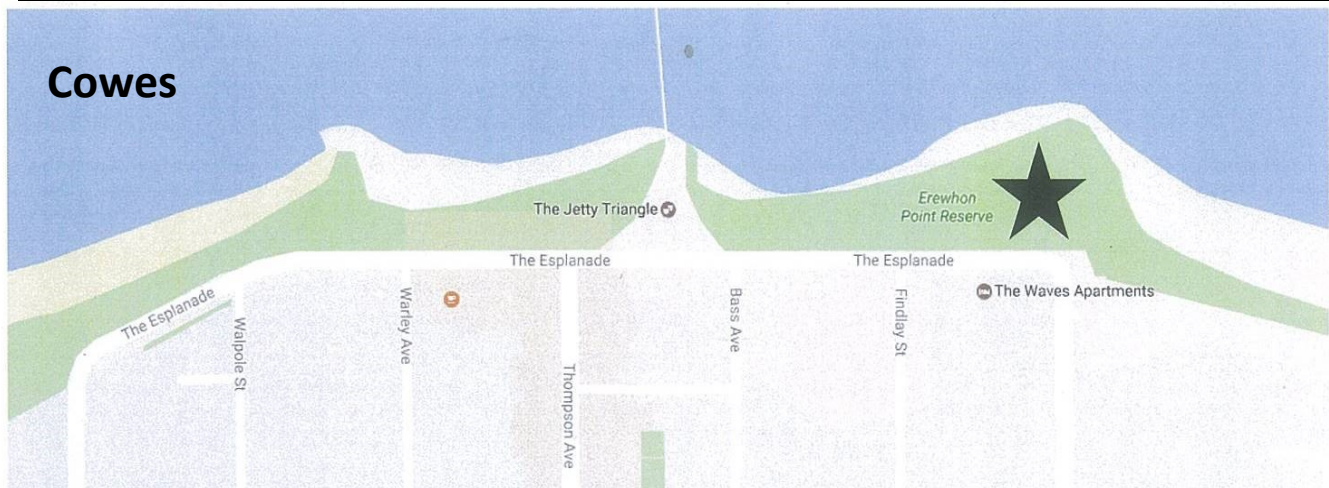

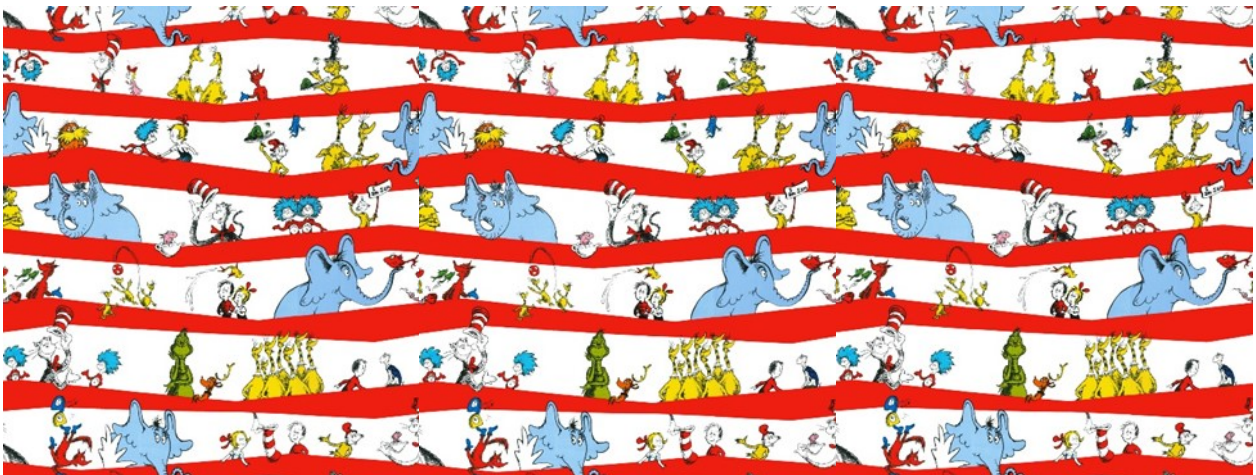
We are looking for a flatbed truck to use for our float.
